Welcome! This service follows "An Order for Celebrating the Holy Eucharist" (BCP p. 400), a flexible form which we use to craft worship especially suitable for children and their friends of any age. There is room in our worship for interaction and play, as well as unplanned sounds and events. Upon entering, children are invited to **take a plain "Prayer Card" and write or draw a prayer or thanksgiving**, which will be shared with all by the priest during the service. We encourage older persons to help younger persons with **reading (or memorizing) the words in bold**.

Worship for this season has been adapted from the 1979 Episcopal Book of Common Prayer (BCP) and the Episcopal resource, Enriching our Worship. Again, welcome!

This service **is not** livestreamed or recorded.

Liturgy of Word and Prayer

The People Gather

We greet one another informally, then warm up our voices and spirits by practicing one or two of the day's songs.

All standing, the presiding priest or minister then says:

Alleluia! Christ is risen.

The Lord is risen indeed. Alleluia!

The Proclamation

From the Acts of the Apostles

Acts 17:22-31

Paul stood in front of the Areopagus and said, "Athenians, I see how extremely religious you are in every way. For as I went through the city and looked carefully at the objects of your worship, I found among them an altar with the inscription, 'To an unknown god.' What therefore you worship as unknown, this I proclaim to you. The God who made

the world and everything in it, he who is Lord of heaven and earth, does not live in shrines made by human hands, nor is he served by human hands, as though he needed anything, since he himself gives to all mortals life and breath and all things. From one ancestor he made all nations to inhabit the whole earth, and he allotted the times of their existence and the boundaries of the places where they would live, so that they would search for God and perhaps grope for him and find him—though indeed he is not far from each one of us. For 'In him we live and move and have our being'; as even some of your own poets have said,

'For we too are his offspring.'

Since we are God's offspring, we ought not to think that the deity is like gold, or silver, or stone, an image formed by the art and imagination of mortals. While God has overlooked the times of human ignorance, now he commands all people everywhere to repent, because he has fixed a day on which he will have the world judged in righteousness by a man whom he has appointed, and of this he has given assurance to all by raising him from the dead."

- + We commend to your mercy all who have died, that your will for them may be fulfilled; and we pray that we may share with all your saints in your eternal kingdom...

All who are drawn to the way of Jesus Christ are welcome to receive sacramental Communion in the community of Trinity Church. Instructions for receiving Communion follow the Great Thanksgiving.

The Great Thanksgiving

(Eucharistic Prayer 3, Enriching Our Worship 1)

The Lord be with you.

And also with you.

Lift up your hearts.

We lift them to the Lord.

Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

It is right to give our thanks and praise.

The Presider continues, concluding...
And so as the morning stars sing your praises we join the heavenly beings and all creation as we shout with joy:

(sung to Land of Rest)

Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest.
Blessed is the one who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest.

The Presider continues in praise of God with the intention of the season or day, then bids the congregation proclaim our faith

...and presenting to you these gifts your earth has formed and human hands have made, we acclaim you, O Christ:

The Presider recounts the last supper and invokes the Holy Spirit upon the bread and wine, concluding

...Through Christ and with Christ and in Christ, by the inspiration of your Holy Spirit, we worship you our God and Creator in voices of unending praise.

Blessed are you now and for ever. AMEN.

As our Savior Christ has taught us, let us pray

Our Father in heaven,
hallowed be your name.
Your kingdom come,
your will be done
On earth as it is in heaven.
Give us today our daily bread.

Forgive us our sins
as we forgive those who sin against us.
Save us from the time of trial
and deliver us from evil.
For the kingdom, the power,
and the glory are yours,
Now and forever. Amen.

The Presider breaks the consecrated Bread, announcing

Alleluia! Christ our Passover is sacrificed for us.

Therefore let us keep the feast. Alleluia!

The Presider offers God's gifts to God's people

On Receiving Holy Communion: To receive, come up the central aisle and extend your hands at full length, palms up. Those who wish may receive the consecrated wine by sipping from the chalice or from the tray of individual servings. Gluten-free wafers are available upon request. If you would like instead a spoken blessing from the priest, please come forward and cross your arms over your chest.

Keep us firm in the hope you have set before us, so we and all your children shall be free, and the whole earth live to praise your name.

A blessing may be given. The service concludes with a song and dismissal.



Let us go forth to share in the spirit of the risen Christ! Alleluia, alleluia! Thanks be to God. Alleluia, alleluia!
