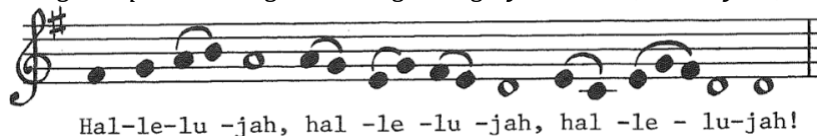
First Reading Acts 1:6-14 (insert)

For the Psalm of the Day Psalm 68:4-8,17-18 (BCP p. 676)

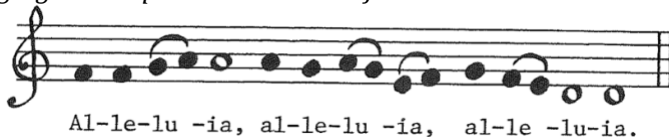
The following antiphon is sung at the beginning by the choir, then by all, and then repeated as indicated.



Second Reading 1 Peter 4:12-14, 5:6-11 (insert)

Alleluia verse (All stand)

The congregation repeats the Alleluia after the cantor and at the conclusion of the verse.

Proclamation of the Holy Gospel John 17:1-11

Before the gospel:

Gospeller The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ, according to John.
People **Glory to you, Lord Christ.**

After the gospel:

Gospeller The Gospel of the Lord.
People **Praise to you, Lord Christ.**

The People respond after each prayer bidding, "Hear our prayer."

The Peace

Presider The peace of Christ be always with you.

People **And also with you.**

The congregation greet one another in the Spirit of Christ.

Liturgy of the Table: Holy Communion

All are welcome to approach the altar, the Lord's Table, and all who are drawn to God in the way of Jesus Christ are welcome to receive Holy Communion in this community. Instructions for Holy Communion follow the Great Thanksgiving.

During the offertory, gifts of bread of wine for the altar and offerings in support of the ministries of the Church are brought forward to be blessed and consecrated.

Celebrant Lift up your hearts. *People* We lift them to the Lord.

Celebrant Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People It is right to give him thanks and praise.

The Presider gives praise to God for the work of creation through Christ, ending

Therefore we praise you, joining our voices with Angels and Archangels and with all the company of heaven, who for ever sing this hymn to proclaim the glory of your Name:

The people stand or kneel. The Presider then continues, recalling Jesus' institution of the Eucharist at the Last Supper and bidding all to proclaim our faith

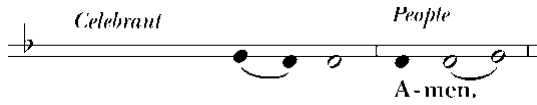
Presider (chanting) Therefore, according to his command, O Father,
