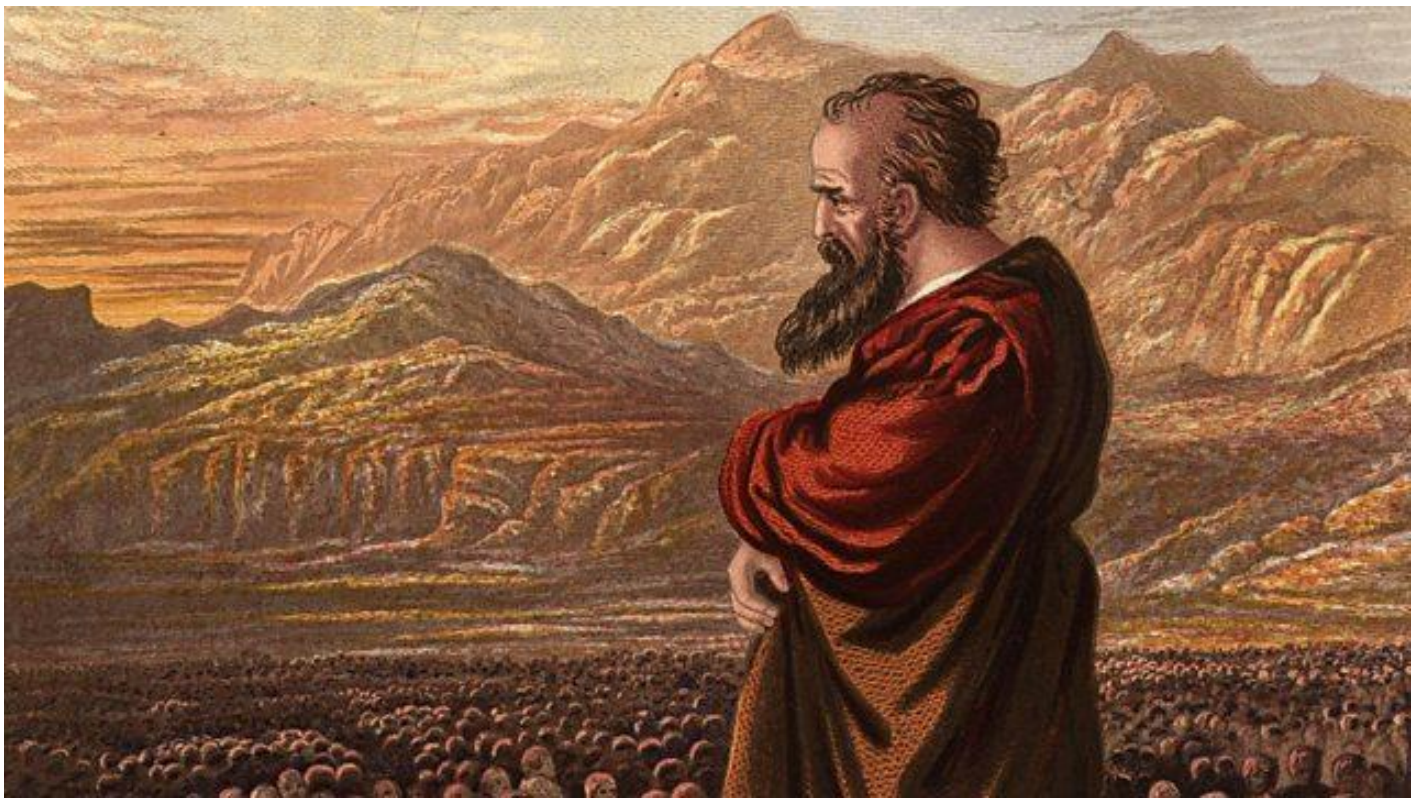

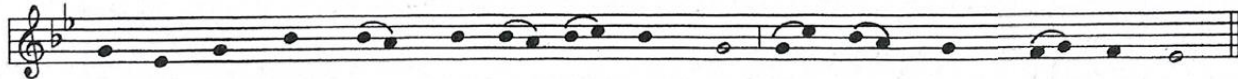

The People respond after each prayer bidding variously, as in the Book of Common Prayer.

Confession and Absolution BCP p. 360

Presider The peace of Christ be always with you.
People **And also with you.**

All are invited to share a sign of Christ's peace. Announcements follow. Gifts of bread and wine for the table, and contributions toward the ministries of the church, are brought forward to be consecrated and blessed.

Liturgy of the Table: Holy Communion

All are welcome to come to the altar rail. All who are drawn to God in the way of Jesus Christ are welcome to receive Holy Communion in the community of Trinity Church. Instructions for receiving sacramental Communion follow the Great Thanksgiving.

The Great Thanksgiving

Eucharistic Prayer B, BCP p. 367

The people remain standing. The Presider, whether bishop or priest, faces them and sings or says

Celebrant People
The Lord be with you. And al - so with you.

Celebrant People
Lift up your hearts. We lift them to the Lord.

Celebrant
Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

People
It is right to give him thanks and praise.

The Great Thanksgiving continues with praise to God for the work of creation through Christ, as appropriate to the day or season.

Sanctus

Hymnal 1982 S-125

The Great Thanksgiving continues with a history of God's love, to include Jesus's last meal with his followers in the event of the Last Supper. The Presider then asks the congregation to affirm the faith of the Church.

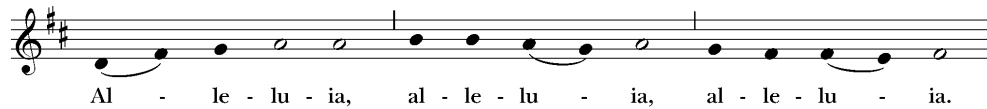

Gluten-free wafers are available upon request. Wine-host may be received by sipping directly from the chalice or from the tray of individual servings. If you would like instead a spoken blessing from the priest, please cross your arms over your chest.
